Well what an amazing journey, I can't wait to read all the stories the rest of you have to tell. Since we were all there, mostly in the same place at the same time, one would think we may have garnered the same experiences but this will no doubt be proven a falsehood.

The treasure house of experience, graciously gifted by our amazing hosts will no doubt be a blessing we can each continue to embrace and share for all time.

My story unfolds with the initial calling, to say I was very resistant and required many pono paddle slaps to get me on board would be a vast understatement. Once in Hawai'i my resistance still remained and I often found myself feeling awkward and ill at ease, my sense of I don't fit in was a constant companion. I struggled to learn Hula, words to the songs and chants would drift from my memory banks as swiftly as they came and my sense of "I'm just not getting this human experience", echoed in my mind. One time on the bus staring out of the window the tears of despair and loneliness flowed silently down my cheeks as I wallowed in my "I just don't fit in essence." I struggled to stay in the sun and stand for long periods with my back aching and I so wanted to scream "this is not for me, I want to get on a plane and go home, to my quiet, secure mountain and continue to plod along at my own pace and sit in my own solitude." I was feeling more alien than ever, yet in amongst all this, the spirit of my fellow paddlers would embrace, encourage, support and teach me how to become the best me ever, with a word of encouragement here and there and a willingness to spend time with me going over hula steps again and again, with all the aloha and pono of true greatness and no judgement, when I still danced alternate steps.

The final thing that cemented my transformation was kumu Namakanaokalani's (Tracey) gift of a gentle whisper in my ear, that encouraged me to just go at my own pace and do what I can and that our time in the canoe (both figuratively and metaphorically) was not a competition. At first I was like "what do you mean? I'm not competitive, I'm a good sport, surely you have mistaken me for someone else.!" (this was all said inside my head of course, not really that brave to talk back to kumu.) Then the penny dropped and with the sense of a long nurtured burden released, I was now free to recognise, embrace and become the learning "Keia anuenue au la'akea Mau ho'ololi ana i pono au." I am a rainbow of sacred light, ever evolving in my own perfection. Translation just in case someone not paying attention. Hee Hee. Suddenly I found myself able to say It,s ok to be me and to stand proud in my own uniqueness and yet still be part of the amazing ohana that evolved along the journey to Hawai'i.

Where to start ?! This retreat was so far even beyond my experience of previous retreats! Kumu had built relationships & connections with new kumu & kahu which delivered a whole new level of participation in protocol, ceremony, hana ka lima (hands on) & malama 'aina.

Our visits to Mauna Kea & Waipio Valley with Lanakila Mangauil deepened my understanding of place & its relationship to the sacred as well as the myriad connections in the Hawaiian way of thinking about the physical & spiritual realms. These two days with this gifted leader & educator (and wonderful storyteller!) were literally awesome & yet to say that doesn't convey the sheer impact of standing on Mauna Kea in some of the very places as all those who have stood for the mauna to preserve her sacredness, & of gaining a more embodied understanding of the deities relationships to the natural elements. In Waipio Valley we had a very physical experience of the genealogy of the Hawaiian people through the Haloa story & helping with some land clearing & planting kalo.

Other highlights were pono classes wih 'Anake, La'akea & Kumu Neaulani; learning hula & oli wih Kumu Neaulani which we presented to Pele's fiery glow one night at the volcano- chicken skin moment for sure !! An opportunity to malama 'aina & bring the healing energies of oli & pule to the Kuamo'o battlefield at Lekeleke: a place of deep ancestral signifigance in 'Anake & Kumu Neaulani's lineage. A day at Keoua canoe club with Uncle Rafael who shared so much 'ike & aloha with us, talking story & taking us all out to paddle wa'a in the sacred waters of Honaunau. (including dolphins swimming close when some us were swimming off the wa'a !!) Such a concrete experience of 'Anake's teaching of "we're all in the same canoe"

And really the trip had so many moments like that- actual embodied learnings of what we have learned in classes/talkstory/trainings – it was so perfect & seemed like this group was just so ripe for absorbing all the learnings & expanding. I can truly say this was such a pono group & so aloha – I had so much joy from seeing them really embrace everything that was offered & immersing themselves in the "hands on" – practicing hula every evening & on the bus, fully absorbed in the lauhala weaving with La'akea & making ipu heke with the wonderful Mary Amos. Rolling up their sleeves & clearing & planting. I have never seen such focus & joyful commitment to the hana as with these pono paddlers!

We were also blessed to have Kumu's Mahealani & Neaulani & alaka'i La'akea come with the group on most of our adventures, in addition to our classes with them. This really deepened our experiences of protocol, messaging from the Kupuna & flat out fun! And of course the trip would not have been possible or as graceful without our steersman/driver Kana who always brings so much aloha, pono & local knowledge- love you uncle!!

So aside from an abundance of wonderful experiences & memories I bring home with me a renewed experience of the vitality & relevance of Hawaiian culture & spirituality as practiced by elders & the newest generation of practioners alike, as well as having witnessed again the power of these ways to heal & empower ourselves & create sustainable relationships to our natural world.
